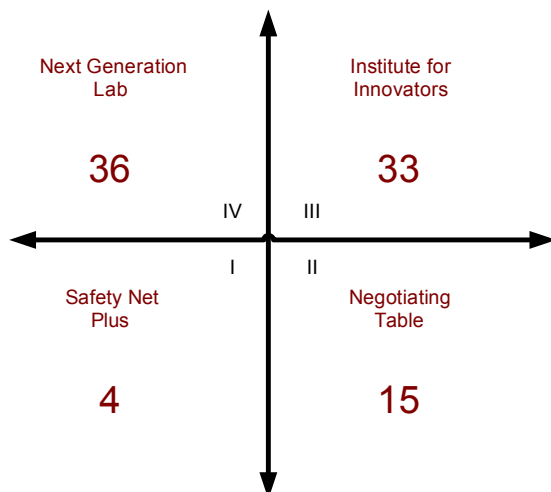

## ENERGY FOR CHANGE

Last night at COSI, more than 110 medical, business, government, patient, community, and non-profit representatives heard a report and participated in an important conversation on health care in our community.

Specifically the group convened to learn about an assessment of "our community's readiness for change to create the conditions necessary to envision and realize health care for all people in Franklin County that is affordable for individuals and sustainable for our community."

Intermixed between dozens of community quotations presented by four readers and interpretation provided by Generon, participants had the opportunity to discuss the following questions:

- Do I see or hear myself in the quotes?
- What do you think is needed in our community?
- What do I have energy to work on?

Last night marked an important step in a process that began last August when community leaders invited Generon Consulting to take the community's pulse on this essential economic, social and political issue. In addition to an initial community meeting with 75 participants, Generon conducted in-depth interviews with 58 individuals from across our community.

Following the presentation of interviews, Generon provided four potential options for advancing health care strategies. After much discussion, a large majority of the group indicated personal interest in two long-term change options. Next Generation Lab was preferred by 36 people, followed closely by Institute for Innovators with 33, Negotiating Table with 15, and Safety Net Plus with 4.

Adam Kahane from Generon pointed out that any one, combination or all of the potential options could be used simultaneously.

Matt Habash closed the meeting with an **open invitation to the community for anyone** to join in a planning session to design an approach for one or more of the potential options.
